## **Study Guide Overview**

- God can "wield the sword" of judgement anyway He wants (v1-2)
- But, we always get a choice in the outcome (v3-5)
- His only desire is to destroy evil, not us (v8)
- In fact, God delights in saving us (v10-12)
- But also giving us the responsibility to share God's saving love (v9)

## **Small Group Questions/Discussions**

Job thought he had the "right" to question God – how did that turn out? Look up the bible reference of God's reply to his questioning. Why is it important to ask questions of God with humility and respect? In our relationship with God, we need to accept our position of weakness – How does this change the tone of our question "How can a loving God send people to Hell?"

What would life be like if all evil and wickedness was removed? To defeat evil there must be judgement – do you agree? What is the good news about judgement? *God's plan is to separate his children from the power of evil for an eternity – so He made a way where evil could no longer have any influence on us or our future. Christ set us free. God's only desire is to destroy evil once and for all – not us.* Do you agree? Is this how you've understood judgement in the past – why is it actually something to celebrate?

Read v10-12. God delights in saving us. God takes no delight in judgment – but is necessary to defeat evil. What is your response? Does this truth change in anyway how you see the love of God?

Read verse 6 and verse 9 – what responsibility do we have once we have been set free from the consequences of our choices?

What has God revealed to you today – What truth has taken hold of you? Try again to answer your non-Christian friend's question – "How can a loving God send people to hell"
